

Voluntary Departure Verification

An alien, who was granted voluntary departure from the United States, is requested to report his/her departure status to a Department of Homeland Security-Homeland Security Investigations (DHS-HSI) representative through submission of the Voluntary Departure Order (G-146, I-392, or I-210).

To apply for verification of voluntary departure, the applicant is required to send the following documents via an Embassy approved courier company:

- Completed **original** G-146, I-392 or I-210 Form;
- Copies of the applicant's passport (including entry/exit stamped pages if available);
- Your **original** airline issued boarding pass when you left the U.S., or an **original** Certificate of Boarding issued by the airline;
- I-94 (the Arrival/Departure record) if available;

Note: Do NOT send documents through courier service (even Ilyang) located in convenience stores. They do not use the same tracking system.

Upon receipt of your documents, they will be reviewed, and you will be contacted for an interview and verification of identity. The normal processing time for departure verification is five working days or longer.
